Yes, the college has its own Management Information System. As a matter of policy, regular upgradation is done and introduction of computerized system is a step in this direction. Computerization of the Offices is complete. MIS is operational. Computerization of Library is still in process.

6.3 Quality improvement strategies adopted by the institution for each of the following:

6.3.1 Curriculum Development

Our teachers/HODs discuss issues related to curriculum development in the departmental committees. Based on this feedback, our teacher, who are members of the boards of UG/PG studies of Punjabi University, contribute in curriculum development. Unit planning of the curriculum is done by the departments in the beginning of the session.

6.3.2 Teaching and Learning

New teaching methodologies, such as case studies, project work, seminars by the students and group discussions are used.

- New techniques based on ICT such as PPTs Projectors, links on various sites, e-journals and INFLIBNET etc. are being used to make the teaching aligned with the changing environment.
- Infrastructure support to augment the facilities for improving class room transaction practices.
- Teachers are encouraged to participate in seminars, workshops and conferences to update themselves. They are allowed duty leave for these days.

6.3.3 Examination and Evaluation

House Examination / MSTs are conducted twice on University pattern during the session.

- Special House Examination is conducted for those who were busy attending sports camps/events or other co-curricular activities during the regular exam days or those students who fail to appear in or failed to qualify the regular house examination.
- Super special House Examination is conducted after remedial classes for academically weak students.
- Evaluated Answer Books are returned to the students with suggestions for improvement. Consolidated result in prepared and analysed by the Register Office and the same is conveyed to students by displaying on the notice boards.

6.3.4 Research and Development

Out of permanent teaching staff in the college, 07 teachers are supervising students for their Ph.D. degree and 15 students have been enrolled as Ph.D students. Nine (9) faculty members are also pursuing Ph.D.

6.3.5 Library, ICT and physical infrastructure / instrumentation

During the academic year 884 books were added to the college library. Beside this library is under process for its computerized up-gradation in order to provide efficient, fast and easy access to the students/faculty for finding required books available in the library.

6.3.6 Human Resource Management

Benefits under CAS are extended to the staff members on the basis of API score without any delay.

- Adhoc teachers with good track record are re-inducted every year which provides them sense of security and belongingness.
- A system is in place for increasing the financial benefit of adhoc staff members.
- Despite the financial crunch of the state govt. and non-receipt of grants in time, salaries and retiral benefits are being paid regularly in time.

6.3.7 Faculty and Staff recruitment

Vacant posts are advertised in leading newspapers and online as well.

- The college remains in touch with heads of the departments of the Universities in surrounding area. This helps us to hire brilliant students through their recommendations.
- Perpetual system of receiving resume is in place. Whenever the need arises, suitable applicants are called for interview and selection is made on the basis of merit.

Various departments of the college have established a reasonably good linkage with the neighbouring industries for doing students project report.
